

CHART 2026: New Galleries, Curated Art Tours and a Stronger Nordic Presence

27-30 August 2026, Kunsthall Charlottenborg, Copenhagen

CHART will take place at Kunsthall Charlottenborg from 27-30 August 2026, continuing its ambition to expand its role as the leading Nordic art fair. Joined by additional galleries from across the region and with an increasingly broad public programme in the city's public spaces, CHART strengthens its position as the central gathering point for the Nordic contemporary art scene.

New galleries join the fair

This year's edition welcomes several new, influential names to the fair, alongside leading galleries from across the Nordics who have participated in previous years. From Denmark, Galleri Nicolai Wallner and von Bartha join the list of exhibitors, as well as Galerie Forsblom from Finland and Galerie Nordenhake from Sweden. Together, the presentations inside the fair make up the core of CHART's activities and offer a comprehensive look at both the diversity of practices but also the common threads that define contemporary art in the region today.

Presented in collaboration with the participating galleries, CHART 2026 will feature a new edition of *Start Collecting with CHART* – a curated exhibition that presents works by established artists under a fixed price threshold of 20.000 DKK / 2700 EUR. The initiative aims to encourage new buyers to take their first steps in the world of art collecting - without compromising on quality or artistic ambition.

CHART beyond Charlottenborg

A key objective for CHART is to bring art out into the city and to meet audiences where they already are. In 2026, the popular Art Running Tours - offering curated routes on-foot to see many of the city's inspiring public artworks - will be expanded. This year also introduces new routes that allow audiences to experience art via public transport, moving through Copenhagen with art as a travelling companion.

Following a successful partnership with the Copenhagen Metro last year, in 2026 the collaboration will continue in an expanded format. During the days of CHART, a series of temporary artworks will be integrated into the Copenhagen Metro network, including performances and video works.

CHART Public returns in 2026 with a new total installation at Charlottenborg, combined with an ambitious programme of performances and live music. In spring 2026, an open call will be launched inviting artists to rethink Charlottenborg's historic architecture and create a sensory environment that merges artistic expression with spaces for gathering and social interaction.

New initiatives and programme details will be announced during spring 2026.
